BEING HUMAN: GROWTH GROUP STUDY 4

"all that I am I give to you, and all that I have I share with you"

On Sunday, we looked at God's design and intent with making us sexual beings. We saw that the union between a husband and a wife is supposed to help us understand the union between Christ and the Church.

Union with Christ is a theme through the New Testament. The phrase used in Romans is "in Christ" as in 16:7 when Paul says that two others were "in Christ" before he was – in other words they became Christians before he did. Read the following verses and note down what we have if we are united to Christ, and try to say how Christ has this to share with us:

Romans 6:11	Life – because Christ is raised from the dead
• Romans 6:23	eternal life - because our sin has been paid for
• Romans 8:1	no condemnation – as above, our sin paid for
• Romans 8:39	God's love – because God loves Jesus
• Romans 12:5	we belong to each other – we are all his bride

Look at the verses from two hymns below. Name that tune! But, use them to respond to the reality of our Union with Christ?

From the Squalor of a borrowed stable / Before the throne of God above

Now He's standing in the place of honour, Crowned with glory on the highest throne, Interceding for His own beloved Till His Father calls to bring them home!
