#### Sand pit

The children have started using and enjoying our large sandpit in the playground. This does mean they are getting a little sandy! Please could you help



us by ensuring that your child has spare **named** clothes, **including socks**, **and wipes** in their bag so that we can change them if needed.

When it gets a little warmer still we will be having outside water play too. They will definitely need spare clothes for this too!

#### Weather Protection

When the weather is sunny and warm, please bring a named sun hat & apply sun lotion before Preschool. If your child stays all day please bring a small labelled bottle of sun lotion, so we can reapply if needed at lunchtime!

#### <u>Snack time</u>

Thank you so much for bringing in a great selection of fruit: apples, oranges, pears, bananas, kiwis etc. The children have also enjoyed trying new fruits too e.g. water mel-

on, pineapple and dragon fruit. What will you bring next to try? Vegetables always welcome too and breadsticks remain very popular.

#### <u>\*N</u>uts\*

We have a couple of children in Pre-school who are allergic to nuts. Please no nuts to be brought in to Pre-school in any form, e.g. peanut butter or contained in foods e.g. biscuits etc., or at any time including lunch club.
